Suddenly I had a sleep shade over my eyes, blindfolding me from seeing anything. I was reliant on my hearing as Andrew beckoned me forward with a white-cane in my hand.

I barely made it up the ramp for fear of tripping. All of my senses other than sight were intensely dialed in. I felt grateful for every bit of verbal guidance. Finding the door made me feel silly. I never think of finding a door, now it feels like a point of shame if I can't find the knob.

At one point I had my fingertips on braille. Although I couldn't decipher it, I was moved that someone had taken the time to create this — to communicate with me in the dark. To reach out to me in a language that I'm supposed to understand.

We all have so much to consider in our crammed lives. Having the brief experience of going through Into the Light — experiencing the feelings of being outside the norms around me, of being helpless in some contexts, and then feeling supported — it completely changed my perspective. Since then, I've been tuned in differently to people around me.

I'm grateful to you and Andrew for having brought this into existence. It's life changing.
